- 3. Boy Scouts vs Cub Scouts.
  - a. Boy run vs adult run.
    - i. SPL runs weekly meeting
    - ii. PLC meeting once a month for anyone with a leadership postion.
  - b. Advancements at the boy's pace, as fast, or as slow as they want.
    - i. Goal is First Class rank in the first year.
    - ii. Summer Camp big part of that goal.
  - c. Parents can no longer sign for advancements.
  - d. Merit badges, more in-depth on a topic than you see in Cub Scouts, many to choose from.
  - e. Troop 57 has merit badge counselors in house for all Eagle required merit badges.
  - f. Safe Scouting, every registered adult leader has to go thru youth protection training, and gets a background check.
  - g. A Scout is never alone with an adult leader, even his child.
  - h. Always report any behavior that seems out of line. We don't want to take any chances with our boys.

  - a. Large, Active Troop, currently.
  - b. Full Class "A" uniforms a requirement.
    - i. Troop has a uniform exchange system for Scouts to turn in their outgrown uniforms for others to use free of charge, first come first serve. Located in the Troop closet.
  - c. Monday night meetings, September through May there are swim nights once a month on the 4<sup>th</sup> Monday at the "N" Center from 7-8:30. Work on Swimming and Lifesaving merit badges and swim tests for camp.

  - ii. Sleeping bag
  - iii. Full uniform, Troop 57 T shirts and sweatshirts.
  - iv. Rain gear
  - v. Boots
  - vi. Backpack
  - vii. Personal hygiene items
- g. Well Funded:

- k. Costs.
  - i. Monthly Dues: \$8.00 per month
  - ii. Outings/Campouts run \$25-\$85 depending on activities.
  - iii. Summer Camp \$325.
  - iv. Typical High Adventure \$1,000-\$1,500.
- I. Communications:
  - i. Make sure we have a good e-mail address for Parent and Scout
  - ii. Troop website (need e-mail for notifications).
  - iii. Troop Facebook page.
  - iv. Handouts at meetings.

- m. When your son joins the troop you will get a policy handbook.

    - i. Summer Camp is possibly the single most important activity for a new Scout.
    - ii. Fun activities.
    - iii. At Summer Camp they work on rank requirements for 1<sup>st</sup> Class requirements.
    - iv. Many Scouts this is the first time away from family.
    - v. A time for personal growth and bonding with his Patrol.
  - b. Age & rank requirements (Generally 13 and 1<sup>st</sup> Class).
  - c. High Adventures: Past D.C., Sea Base (Fla), Philmont (Cimarron, NM), Sid Richardson Scout Ranch in Texas, Grand Canyon, Hawaii, Summit 2015.
    - 1. Philmont ???
    - 2. Sea base ???
- 6. Boy Scouts, and specifically Eagle Scouts
  - a. Troop typically has 3-5 Scouts per year earn the Eagle rank, nationally it is about 2-4% of the total Scouts, Troop 57 is about double that.
